



Examples of Online Volunteer delivery

Nepal: Impacting voter education through digital media

Prior to the 2022 local level elections in Nepal, UNDP and UNV Nepal launched an online campaign "My Vote Matters" which aimed at initiating a national movement to increase the number of aware youth voters in Nepal. This campaign was to encourage and make young people aware of their voting rights and ultimately to utilize them so they would become active and responsible citizens; a way for the youth to express their voice and bring reforms in the government that represents them. As part of the campaign, hundreds Online Volunteers, youth from across the country, were engaged to raise awareness by spreading and sharing content on voting rights created in collaboration with local governments. Fiji: Tackling COVID-19 in Small Island Developing States

In the Pacific, Online Volunteers supported the UNDP Accelerator Lab Pacific in Fiji during the COVID-19 pandemic. They conducted research on the COVID-19 response in Small Island Developing States (SIDS) in the Pacific region, developed materials to share best practices for dealing



with the pandemic, and designed digital transformation maps to capture and understand its impact. Their contributions and inputs were used in several UNDP SIDS-focused platforms, which helped better anticipate future opportunities and threats. Read more here.

Bolivia: Documenting the human rights situation

In Bolivia, the Office of the High Commissioner on Human Rights (OHCHR) engaged Online Volunteers to document the human rights situation and flag possible human rights violations during the national elections. They gathered localized information (from the press, television, social networks, community radios) and documented them in a permanent, remote, and systematized way by developing a departmental-level database of allegations of violations and a mapping of governmental counterparts and civil society organizations.
